## Student Arrivals at school, "8.45 is time to arrive"

We currently have students arriving at school by 8.10am in the morning. This is too early and students are not supervised at this time. Staff duty commences 15 minutes prior (8.40am) to the first bell (8.55am). Parents are asked not to drop students off, or send students to school prior to this time. Mornings are a busy time for all staff, frequently involved in meetings, planning and general organisation.

# School Crossing & Bus Zones

There are a number of parents and students not correctly using the School Crossing at the beginning and end of the school day. It is very important that students are taught the correct and safest way to cross Charlton Road, which is to use the crossing every time, to, get to and from the other side of the road—regardless of whether they are supervised by a parent or adult, or not.

There is ample parking at the top of the school and no road crossing is required, for parents who cannot find a park at the front of the school. School staff are no longer parking along Charlton Road in an effort to reduce congestion in this zone.
