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Principal's Report

School Times

A reminder to parents that children are not to be at school before **8.40am**. Teachers have before school meetings and are not available to supervise students. Due to the technology located in each classroom, early students may arrive to find the room locked. Official supervision time commences at 8.40am, 10 minutes prior to the first session at 8.55am (signalled by the music). The breakfast room is open each day for students to visit, and serving stops at 8.55am.

If you wish to speak to your child's teacher the best idea is to make a time that suits as the mornings can be a very busy time.

If your child is going to be absent or late please contact the school as early as possible—this will save the school having to contact you to confirm your child's wellbeing. Your cooperation with this is greatly appreciated.

Fruit Snack & Water Bottles

A reminder that all students are strongly encouraged to bring along a daily fruit snack, which is eaten at 10am each day. They should bring a piece of fresh fruit or vegetable, eaten easily by the child. Students should also bring their own water bottle to class, which they are encouraged to have on their desk. This should contain only water. Cordial, soft drink, milk etc are not permitted.

Bus Travellers

A reminder that students travelling by bus need a note from parents when a change of arrangement is made. Please do not rely on students to pass on messages about a change to their travel. Parents are welcome to ring the office prior to 2.45pm each day, to make a change to afternoon travel.

All parents are asked to advise and update the office of their child's travel routines for 2022. Your cooperation with this matter ensures the smooth and timely dismissal of bus travellers each afternoon

Lunch Orders—Yay, they are back! We're thrilled to be able to once again offer lunch orders on a Thursday and Friday through Parkview Bakery. Here's a refresher on how to order your child's lunch.

1. Look over the attached Parkview Bakery lunch order menu and select what you wish to order.

2. On a brown paper bag* write your order, clearly stating your child's name, class and food items.

3. Enclose the correct money and remind your child to hand this to their teacher during roll call in the morning.

Our lunch orders are then collected from the school by McCallum Disability Services as part of their Community Connections program. McCallum will bring the fulfilled orders back to class prior to lunchtime beginning. It is important that orders are written on a brown paper bag as that will be used to pack the food items into. Brown paper bags can be purchased from the supermarket in the aisle next to the Gladwrap.

Principal's Report

Mobile Phone Policy

The state government has banned these devices in all government schools. Students who bring a device to school are asked to hand it in to the General Office upon arrival for the day and collect it at the end of the day. This includes all phones, iPods, iPads, smart watches etc. If your child is bringing a device to school, parents are asked to notify the office or the classroom teacher so that these can be stored in a locked cabinet in the General Office for safe keeping, in line with Government policy. The school takes no responsibility for valuables brought to school.

Our Annual Welcome Picnic is set for Monday 7th Feb and will be held on the lovely green front lawns of the Primary School. All parents, grandparents and special friends are welcome to join us for a BYO picnic lunch from 1.30-2pm. This is a really nice way to meet new families and welcome them into the school community as well as catch up with old friends, staff and everyone else. We hope that you can join us.

Safe Travel to school

Students riding, or scooting to school are reminded that they need a **well fitted helmet**, and that all students must use the supervised School Crossing if they need to cross Charlton Rd. Students have been seen crossing at the staff carpark and closer to Powell St. Parents are asked to ensure their children know where to safely cross the road.

Sun Smart School hats

The school has recently received a donation from the St Arnaud Football Club for student hats. The amount given will allow 40 students to receive a reversible bucket hat. We are very grateful to the Footy Club for their kind gesture and generous donation. We have lots of very happy students looking smart in their new hats!

Further to the new hats being issued students have been reminded that these are not to be taken home. Every student has a hat hook or bag box to keep it safely in and as long as it is at school where it can easily be found, no one will have to sit in the shade. All new hats have been clearly named.

Please note that in the event of an emergency, where it is deemed necessary an Ambulance **will be** called for your child- it is vital that parents ensure that they hold a current Ambulance membership. Health Care Card holders should check that Ambulance subscription is covered by their entitlements.

Head Lice

Head lice are active at this time of year. We request parents be mindful of this and to regularly check their child(rens) hair. If detected, parents should inform the relevant classroom teacher. We thank parents for keeping us informed and for everyone's continued cooperation in treating and reporting Head Lice. School policy outlines the requirement that children detected with live lice and eggs are to be sent home and treated. We encourage parents to keep head lice treatment on hand to allow for immediate treatment and for children to return to school and avoid unnecessary loss of class time.

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Important School Bus Information

- In the event that one of the school buses is late and you are concerned. Please contact the Secondary College on 54951811.
- Parents/Guardians must obey the road signs and NOT drop off students around the bus area! This is for the safety of everyone.
- Parents of bus travellers please be aware that under Education Department Guidelines students need to be at their designated bus stop 5 minutes before the pickup time and parents should be at the bus stop 5 minutes before the drop off time.
 - It is not the responsibility of the bus driver to wait for the student either in the morning or afternoon.

It is also requested that parents park their car on the same side as where the bus either picks up or drops off to reduce the risk of your child's safety crossing the road.

- Parents **need** to notify their child's school if they are **not** catching the bus home in the afternoon.
- Parents need to also contact the Secondary College on 54951811 if they wish their child to have friends catch the bus with them. This must be done at least 24 hours before the date of travel.
