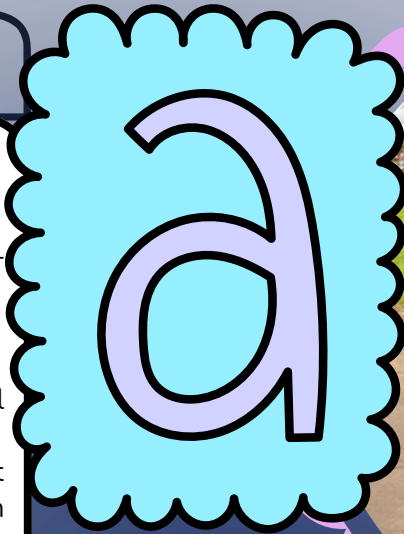

Principal's Report

Student Assessments

Last week classroom teachers were able to complete a significant proportion of the term 2 testing that is required for teachers to accurately allocate progression points for student reports. Teachers have reported a very pleasing level of student engagement, persistence and aspiration demonstrated during the assessments. Semester 1 reports will be released to parents through the COMPASS portal on Monday July 13th (the first day of Term 3) and will be supported by Parent Teacher Interviews in week 2 of Term 3. Parents of all children are strongly encouraged to make a time to discuss their child's report in person. Appointment times can be made through the COMPASS portal and will open to parents on Friday 26th June for Mon-Thurs 20-23 July.

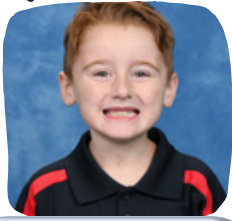
Attendance
