

#### Staffing Update

We are pleased to advise that Molly Hendy has been successful in her application for Permission to Teach from the Victorian Institute of Teaching and will be taking ICT and Art for the remainder of the year. Molly will be supported with curriculum development by Learning Specialist Emily Gosden and Melissa Weir will be her Teacher Mentor. Congratulations Molly - you will be as amazing in front of the classtoom as you have been supporting students from within over the last 3 years.

#### School Maintenance

Over the holidays there were a number of maintenance items carried out to keep our school safe and looking great;

- -Split systems were serviced
- -Solar panels were cleaned
- -Routine electrical testing was performed
- -Arborist checked and trimmed trees two gums with splits in the trunk were removed.
- -White Ant treatment was carried out
- -Lockers were installed in the 2/3T Breezeway
- -Arbour installed in the Kitchen Garden for climbing fruit and vegetables
- -Gaga Pit was constructed

A big thank you to Trevor and Jo Baldock for their donation of composted soil which will be used to top up vegetable gardens in coming weeks.

#### Year 3 and 4 Urban Camp

It is a requirement of the school that the camp is paid for in full approx 4 weeks prior to the departure date. It is also extremely important that if anyone pulls out this is communicated as early as possible due to the impact to the cost of the camp. Every effort is made to keep costs low but this also means there is little to no buffer when numbers change after planning is finalised. If you are having any difficulty making the camp payments we encourage you to speak with Melissa Weir or make a payment plan with Jenny in the General Office.

#### Student Asthma and Anaphylaxis Management

It is imperative that if your child has a diagnosis of Asthma or Anaphylaxis, that the school has a recent Managament Plan completed by your GP. These should be reviewed and updated every 12 months. In the event of an emergency involving your child it is vital that staff have access to the most up to date information to ensure your child receives the medical intervention required.

#### Safety at School

This week we practiced the T3 Evacuation Drill with all staff and students participating. We were able to safely evacuate everyone to the Air Strip in around 3 minutes.

On Monday afternoon all school staff undertook their full First Aid Training including CPR, Anaphylaxis and Asthma.

#### School Saving Bonus

The School Saving Bonus program is now in the final phase. From June 30 families are no longer able to purchase textbooks and uniforms, with all unspent funds converting into a school activities credit. With school camps approaching for years 3-6, parents may be looking to this funding to assist with camp payments. If you require a balance, please check with Jenny in the General Office.

Parent Payments that have not been finalised should be paid off in coming months. These funds are used to provide students with learning materials for the classroom. Your payment allows the school to maximise the use of school funding in other areas of the school. Thank you to those families who have or are paying these in full.

#### 2026 Enrolments

Enrolments for all year levels are now open and an Enrolment Pack can be collected from the General Office. To allow our school to be fully planned and staffed for 2026 we encourage enrolments by the end of September, although this is not a firm cut off and will be accepted at any time of the year - it would allow us to ensure that resources are in place to support all learners, keep our class sizes to a minimum and be in a position to advise families of the class structure for 2026 in time for Step Up Day in December. If you know of families looking to enrol, moving to the area or interested in a school tour, please encourage them to contact the school.



#### Dear parents, guardians and carers

#### Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

#### Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

· year of schooling

- · category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- · level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

#### This information assists schools to:

- · formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
  - · consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.
- The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.
- The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information.
