Electronic Sign In

Our school now has an electronic sign in kiosk located in the foyer, replacing the paper and pen sign in books for visitors, contractors and late students.

The new device will help us to track who is signed in; ensure all visitors and contractors have a Working With Children Check; as well as monitor students who arrive late and leave early.

As a result of the new system coming into place we ask that parents and visitors comply with the following:

- -Parents dropping students off late accompany students to the Foyer to sign in
- -Parents collecting students from school early, report to the Foyer to sign students out. Office staff will phone class or have students awaiting collection
- -Visitors, parents and contractors on site for school business, meetings and appointments, report to the Foyer and sign in; Office staff will assist you with notifiying staff that you are here, or take you to the meeting room.
