#### Parent Teacher Interviews

Interviews are scheduled for next week and are a time where teachers are available specifically to meet with parents and discuss student progress and achievement. All parents are encouraged to make an appointment. Currently there are just on 50% of students booked in for an interview.

#### Staffing Update

This term we welcome Mrs Chloe Coates to the 2/3T teaching team. She will be coteaching with Ms Thursby and will be in the classroom on Wednesdays and Fridays for the remainder of the year. The class continues to be supported by Lisa Wright and Kelly Leach, with Chloe Cook in on Fridays. With the combined passion, wisdom and talent of this team the students are in great hands! Chloe Cook joins our team in an Education Support role this term. Chloe has worked casually in this role regularly during Term 2 and is a very resourceful and effective support to students.

We also welcome back Speech Pathologist Aleshia Petrie! Aleshia will be here on Wednesdays each week working with children and supporting our language programs in classrooms. We are extremely fortunate to have this valuable service based in our school. Aleshia joins Annabel (Occupational Therapist - Tuesdays) and Jojo (Counsellor - Fridays) in our Allied Health Team and provides a wealth of knowledge to staff and parents. Welcome back Aleshia.

We hope to have an announcement regarding the Art and ICT position in the very near future.

#### 2026 Enrolments

As we head into Term 3 we are beginning the planning for 2026. Enrolments for all year levels are now open and an Enrolment Pack can be collected from the General Office. To allow our school to be fully planned and staffed for 2026 we are encouraging enrolments to be processed by the end of September, although this is not a firm cut off and enrolments are taken at any time of the year - it would allow us to ensure that resources are in place to support all learners, keep our class sizes to a minimum and be in a position to advise families of the class structure for 2026 in time for Step Up Day in December. ## Year 3 and 4 Urban Camp

With the Urban Camp falling in week 8 of next term, the school is calling on parents to commence their payments for the camp. It is a requirement of the school that the camp is paid for in full approx 4 weeks prior to the date. It is also extremely important that if anyone pulls out this is communicated as early as possible due to the impact to the cost of the camp. Every effort is made to keep costs as low as possible but this also means there is little to no buffer when numbers change after planning is finalised.

If you are having any difficulty making the camp payments we encourage you to speak with Melissa Weir or make a payment plan with Jenny in the General Office.

### Student Asthma and Anaphylaxis Management

It is imperative that if your child has a diagnosis of Asthma or Anaphylaxis, that the school has a recent Managament Plan completed by your GP. These should be reviewed and updated every 12 months.

In the event of an emergency involving your child it is vital that staff have access to the most up to date information to ensure your child receives the medical intervention required.

#### Staff First Aid

Next Monday afternoon all staff will be involved in First Aid Training including CPR, Asthma and Anaphylaxis management.

#### 2025 NAPLAN Yr 3 and Yr 5

The school has recently received the Individual Student Report for each child you undertook NAPLAN testing at our school. These will be distributed to parents at Parent Teacher interviews next week.

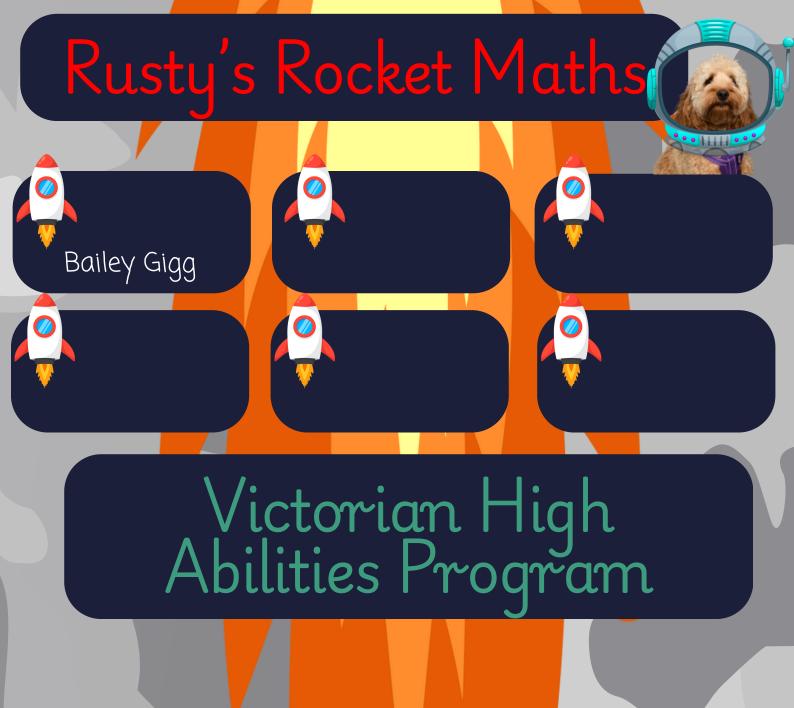

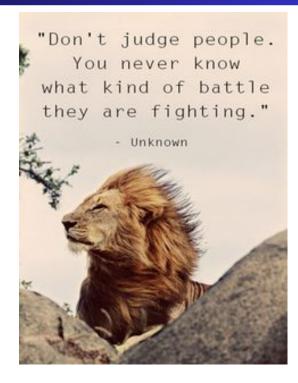
## What I enjoy about being a Wellbeing Leader?
