Dear Parent

School Councils in Victorian government schools are permitted to request payments for certain educational items and services from families while their child attends the school. They are entitled to request payments from parents under three categories. The three categories are:

<u>Essential Education Items</u> - These are items or services that are essential to support the instruction in standard curriculum programs. (These are additional to the student booklists which are a separate cost.) Parents or guardians are <u>expected</u> to pay the school for these items or services. The school purchases these items in bulk and at very competitive prices.

Optional Items - These items or services are provided in addition to the standard curriculum program and are offered to all children.

<u>Voluntary Items</u> - These items and services enhance the school environment and provide stimulating resources for students. Parents or guardians are invited to make a contribution towards these items and services.

St Arnaud Primary School Parent Payments

The St Arnaud Primary School makes every effort to ensure that costs and fees are kept to a minimum. However, Parent Payments form an important part of our school's financial operation and play a significant role in providing a broad range of learning opportunities to meet the educational needs of your children. There are a number of <u>User Pay events</u> that are paid for at the time of the event. These events include visiting performances, camps, excursions and some sporting events.

Payment Support

We have endeavoured to make these Parent Payments as affordable as possible for all families. If you have difficulty in paying these Parent Payments please make an appointment to speak to the Principal to discuss possible support options or flexible payment arrangements. All information about your financial circumstances, payment arrangements or status will be kept strictly confidential.

Payment Method

The 2020 Parent Payments can either be paid as a <u>one off payment</u> or on a <u>payment plan</u>. Please fill in the appropriate section of the attached Payment Agreement. The School Charges can be paid at the front office by cheque/cash or by BPay.

Refunds

Our school will consider requests for partial or full refunds of payments made by parents on a case by case basis taking into account the individual circumstances. Generally we will not be able to refund payments made for items purchased or costs that have already been paid where those funds have already been transferred to a third party. For example, camp costs when a child becomes unwell and cannot attend in circumstances where the payment has already been made or committed to a third party and no refund is available to the school. Where possible, we will make this clear to parents at the time of payment.



CSEF Information for Parents



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments**; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
