
#### School Chaplaincy Program

## 10 minute Mac 'n Cheese Muffins

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 200 g macaroni
- 50 g butter
- 50 g plain flour
- 50 ml milk
- 250 g cheese (grated)
- 200 g baby spinach leaves (cooked, roughly chopped)
- 200 g ham (deli) (chopped)
- 1/4 bunch chives (finely chopped)



- 1. Preheat oven to  $180C^{\circ}$  fan forced or  $200C^{\circ}$  convection
- 2. Cook macaroni in a large pot of salted water according to packet instructions.
- 3. Meanwhile melt butter in a medium sauce pan and add the flour.
- 4. Cook, stirring for 1 minute over medium low heat.
- 5. Gradually add the milk, whisking until smooth. Stir gently until mixture comes just to

# **Upcoming works**

We're improving safety along St Arnaud-Charlton Road, St Arnaud, as part of the jointly funded program to deliver shovel-ready infrastructure projects and urgent road safety improvements in Victoria.

#### What we're doing

The improvements we're making include:

- Electronic speed signs that flash during peak school hours at St Arnaud Primary School on the St Arnaud-Charlton Road, St Arnaud, ahead of the existing 40km/h school zone
- New static signs to further alert drivers of 40km/h speed limit

#### When to expect us

We're starting works in early June 2021 and construction is expected to finish at the end of July 2021. Crews will be onsite Monday to Friday from 9.30am to 2.30pm

#### What impacts can I expect?

During works, drivers can expect the following:

- One lane at a time will be closed during works
- Access to properties will be maintained at all times
- Traffic controllers will be onsite to help drivers move through the area safely.
- During the construction period, you may notice the electronic speed limit signs we've installed on St Arnaud-Charlton Road, St Arnaud, are not operating. Please obey the speed limit displayed on the static signs, while we work to connect power onsite.
- If you're travelling through the area, keep an eye out for changed traffic conditions, plan ahead and allow up to five minutes extra travel time.



### Why we're doing it?

Infrastructure plays a vital role in keeping you safe on our roads.

By installing new safety features on St Arnaud-Charlton Road, St Arnaud, we can help to prevent serious crashes from happening or reduce the severity of crashes when they're unavoidable.

St Arnaud Road, St Arnaud will be made safer thanks to the \$410,000 investment in the Grampians region for pedestrian safety improvements, funded by the joint Victorian and Australian Government's Targeted Road Safety Works program.
